A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

THEREAS it hath been reprefented unto Us, that on the Eleventh Day of this inftant July, a certain fcandalous and feditious Paper was printed and published in the Town of Birmingham, and published in the Parts thereunto adjacent, in Our Counties of Warwick and Worcefter, of the following Tenor :- ". My Coun-" trymen ! The Second Year of Gallic Liberty is " nearly expired. At the Commencement of the " Third on the Fourteenth of this Month, it is " devoutly to be wished, that every Enemy to Civil " and Religious Defpotifm would give his Sanction er to the Majestic Common Cause, by a Public " Celebration of the Anniverfary. Remember that " on the Fourteenth of July the Bastille, that high « Altar and Caftle of Despotism, fell. Remember " the Enthufiafm, peculiar to the Caufe of Liberty, « with which it was attacked. Remember that " generous Humanity, that taught the oppressed, " groaning under the Weight of infulted Rights, to " fave the Lives of Oppreffors ! Extinguish the " mean Prejudices of Nations ; and let your Num-. bers be collected, and fent as a Free-will Offering " to the National Affembly. But is it possible to " forget that your own Parliament is venal ! Your " Ministers hypocritical ! Your Clergy legal Op-

preffors! The Reigning Family extravagant ! " The Crown of a certain Great Personage be-" coming every Day too weighty for the Head that " wears it ! too weighty for the People who gave " it ! Your Taxes partial and exceffive-Your Re-" prefentation a cruel Infult upon the facred Rights " of Property, Religion, and Freedom,- But on the " Fourteenth of this Month, prove to the political " Sycophants of the Day that you reverence the " Olive Branch, that you will facrifice to Public " Tranquillity, till the Majority shall exclaim, " The Peace of Slavery is worfe than the War of " Freedom .- Of that Moment let Tyrants be-" ware !"-We, therefore, in order to bring to a fpeedy condign Punishment the Publishers of the Paper aforefaid, and that Practices fo highly dangerous to the Public Tranquillity and Welfare may hereafter be prevented, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and enjoining all Juffices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors. Bailiffs, Conftables, and all other Our loving Subjects, to be aiding and affifting to the utmost of their Power in detecting, apprehending and bringing to Justice the Publishers of the Paper aforefaid : And, for the better Detection of the faid Publishers, We are gracioufly pleafed to promife, that if any Perfon shall discover any other Person or Persons concerned in publishing the printed Paper aforefaid, by diffributing the fame, or otherwife, fo as the Perfon or Perfors



Perfons discovered may be brought to Justice for the fame, fuch Difcoverers shall have and receive as a Reward, upon Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders, the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for each and every fuch Offender, and alfo Our gracious Pardon, in cafe the Perfon making fuch Difcovery shall himseif be liable to be profecuted for the fame, except the Perfon or Perfons fo difcovering be the Author or Authors of the Paper aforefaid: And the Commissioners for executing the Office of Treasurer of Our Exchequer are hereby required to make Payment accordingly of the faid Rewards. Given at Our Court at St. James's the Twenty-feventh Day of July, One Thoufand Seven Hundred and Ninety-one, in the Thirty-first Year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS it hath been represented unto Us, that a great Number of diforderly Perfons, in and about the Town of Birmingham in Our County of Warwick, did, on the Fourteenth Day of July instant, assemble themselves in a tumultuous Manner, and for feveral Days thereafter, and during the Time aforefaid, did fet Fire to, burn, or otherwife destroy, fundry Dwelling-Houses, Mills, and other Buildings, with the Furniture and other Effects found in the fame, to divers of Our Subjects belongin, in the faid Town of Birmingham, and in other Places thereunto adjacent, in Our Counties of Warwick and Worcester; and also Two Meeting-Houles, belonging to Protestant Diffenters, in the Town of Birmingham aforefaid; and did alfo by Force or Terror illegally take Money from divers of Our Subjects: We therefore, taking the fame into Our most ferious Confideration, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish and declare Our Resolution, That the Authors; Abettors and Perpetrators of the faid Offences be profecuted as expeditionally as may be, according to the due Course of Law: And We do hereby enjoin and require all Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Constables, and all other Our loving Subjects, to be aiding and affifting, to the utmost of their Power, in detecting, apprehending and bringing to Justice the faid Offenders : And We are graciously pleased to promise, That if any Person shall discover any other Person or Persons, who are guilty of any of the faid Offences, fo as that the Perfon or Perfons discovered may be prosecuted for the same,

fuch Difcoverer shall have and receive as a Reward, upon Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders, the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for each and every such Offender, and also Our gracious Pardon. for the faid Offence, in cafe the Perfon making fuch Difcovery shall himfelf be liable to be profecuted for the fame; except the Perfon who first began to fet Fire to, burn or deftroy the faid Dwelling-Houses, Mills, and other Buildings: And the Commissioners for executing the Office of Treasurer of Our Exchequer are hereby required to make Payment accordingly of the faid Rewards. Given at Our Court at St. James's the Twenty-feventh Day of July, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninetyone, in the Thirty-first Year of Our Reign.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majelty was graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twenty-fifth Day of March last, to promife and declare, (amongst other Things) That a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majefty's Service, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majelly's Royal Navy, in Manner therein mentioned; which Bounties have been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this instant July; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the faid Bounties fhould continue to be paid to fuch Able and Ordinary Seamen for fome Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Time limited for Payment of fuch Bounties be prolonged and extended, and that the fame do continue to be paid to every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit for His Majeity's Service, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall, on or before the Thirty-first Day of August next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Regulating Captains, or the Lieutenants employed under them, in London, or with the Captains or Lieutenants of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels of War: Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
