HEREAS it hath been represented unto Us, that on the Eleventh Day of this inflant July, a certain scandalous and feditious Paper was printed and published in the Town of Birmingham, and published in the Parts thereunto adjacent, in Our Counties of Warwick and Worcester, of the following Tenor :- " My Coun-" trymen! The Second Year of Gallic Liberty is " nearly expired. At the Commencement of the "Third on the Fourteenth of this Month, it is " devoutly to be wished, that every Enemy to Civil and Religious Despotism would give his Sanction to the Majestic Common Cause, by a Public " Celebration of the Anniversary. Remember that on the Fourteenth of July the Bastille, that high " Altar and Castle of Despetism, fell. Remember " the Enthusiasm, peculiar to the Cause of Liberty, with which it was attacked. Remember that egenerous Humanity that taught the oppressed, " groaning under the Weight of insulted Rights, to " fave the Lives of Oppressors! Extinguish the " mean Prejudices of Nations; and let your Num-" bers be collected, and sent as a Free-will Offering to the National Assembly. But is it possible to " forget that your own Parliament is venal! Your " Ministers hypocritical! Your Clergy legal Op-" pressors! The Reigning Family extravagant! "The Crown of a certain Great Personage be-" coming every Day too weighty for the Head that

wears it! too weighty for the People who gave " it! Your Taxes partial and excessive-Your Re-" presentation a cruel Insult upon the sacred Rights " of Property, Religion, and Freedom .- But on the " Fourteenth of this Month, prove to the political Sycophants of the Day that you reverence the " Olive Branch, that you will facrifice to Public "Tranquillity, till the Majority shall exclaim, " The Peace of Slavery is worle than the War of " Freedom. - Of that Moment let Tyrants be-" ware !"-We, therefore, in order to bring to a speedy condign Punishment the Publishers of the Paper aforefaid, and that Practices so highly dangerous to the Public Tranquillity and Welfare may hereafter be prevented, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and enjoining all Justices of the Peace, Sheriffy, Mayors, Bailiffs, Constables, and all other Our loving Subjects, to be aiding and affilting to the utmost of their Power in detecting, apprehending and bringing to Just ce the Publishers of the Paper aforesaid: And, for the better Detection of the faid Publishers, We are graciously pleased to promise, that if any Person shall discover any other Person or Persons concerned in publishing the printed Paper aforefaid, by distributing the same, or otherwise, so as the Person or Persons discovered may be brought to Justice for the fame, such Discoverers shall have and receive a a Reward, upon Conviction of such Offerder or Offenders, the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS. for each and every such Offender, and also Our gragracieus

ocious Pardon, in case the Person making such Disscovery shall himself be liable to be prosecuted for the same, except the Per on or Persons so d scoverzing beethe Author or Authors of the Paper aforefaid: And the Commissioners for executing the Office of Treasurer of Our Exchequer are hereby required to make Payment accordingly of the faid Rewards. HEREAS it hath been represented unto Us, that a great Number of disorderly Per-Tons, in and about the Town of Birmingham in Our County of Warwick, did, on the Fourtzenth! Day of July instant, assemble themselves in a tumultuous Manner, and for several Days thereafter, and during the Time aforefaid, did fet Fire to, burn, or otherwise destroy, sundry Dwelling-Houses, Mills, and other Buildings, with the Furniture and other Effects found in the same, to divers of Our Subjects belongin, in the faid Town of Birmingham, and in other Places thereunto adjacent, in Our Counties of Warwick and Worcester; and also Two Meeting-Houses, belonging to Protestant Diffenters, in the Town of Birmingham aforefaid; and did also by Force or Terror illegally take Money from divers of Our Subjects: We therefore, taking the fame into Our most serious Coasideration, have thought sit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish and declare Our Resolution, That the Authors, Abettors and Perp trators of the faid Offences be profecuted as expeditionly as may be, according to the due Course of Law: And We do hereby enjoin and require all Justices of the Peace, Sherisfs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Contables, and all other Our loving Subjects, to be ailing and affilling, to the utmost of their Power, in detecting, app chending and bringing to Justice the fail Offenders: And We are graciously pleased to promise, That if any Person shall discover any other Person or Persons, who are guilty of any of the faid Offences, fo as that the Person or Persons discovered may be prosecuted for the same, fuch Discoverer shall have and receive as a Reward, upon Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders, the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for each an. every fuch Offender, and also Our gracious Pardon: for the faid Offence, in case the Person making fuch Di covery shall kimself be liable to be prosecuted for the same; except the Person who first began to let Fire to, burn or defiroy the faid Dwelling- I Thurslay the Third Day of November next.

HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamat on, bearing Date the Tayenty-fifth Day of March last, to promise and declare, (amongst other Things) That a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Scaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majesty's Service, who should, on or before the Thirty first Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, in Manner therein mentioned; which Bounties have been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this instant July; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the fail Boun ies should contique to be paid to fuch Able and Ordinary Seamen for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Time limited for Payment of fich Bounties be prolonged and extended, and that the same do continue to be paid to every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit for His Majesty's Service, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall, on or before the Thirty-first Day of August next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Regulating Captains, or the Lieutenants employed under them, in London, or with the Captions or Lieutenants of any of His Majelly's Shi, s or Vesses of War: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves
