HEREAS it hath been represented unto Us, that a great Number of disorderly Per-Tons, in and about the Town of Birmingham in Our County of Warwick, did, on the Fourtzenth! Day of July instant, assemble themselves in a tumultuous Manner, and for several Days thereafter, and during the Time aforefaid, did set Fire to, burn, or otherwise destroy, sundry Dwelling-Houses, Mills, and other Buildings, with the Furniture and other Effects found in the same, to divers of Our Subjects belongin, in the faid Town of Birmingham, and in other Places thereunto adjacent, in Our Counties of Warwick and Worcester; and also Two Meeting-Houses, belonging to Protestant Diffenters, in the Town of Birmingham aforefaid; and did also by Force or Terror illegally take Money from divers of Our Subjects: We therefore, taking the fame into Our most serious Coasideration, have thought sit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish and declare Our Resolution, That the Authors, Abettors and Perp trators of the faid Offences be profecuted as expeditionly as may be, according to the due Course of Law: And We do hereby enjoin and require all Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Contables, and all other Our loving Subjects, to be ailing and affilling, to the utmost of their Power, in detecting, app chending and bringing to Justice the fail Offenders: And We are graciously pleased to promise, That if any Person shall discover any other Person or Persons, who are guilty of any of the faid Offences, fo as that the Person or Persons discovered may be prosecuted for the same, fuch Discoverer shall have and receive as a Reward, upon Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders, the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for each an. every fuch Offender, and also Our gracious Pardon: for the faid Offence, in case the Person making fuch Di covery shall kimself be liable to be prosecuted for the same; except the Person who first began to let Fire to, burn or defiroy the faid Dwelling- I Thurslay the Third Day of November next.

HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamat on, bearing Date the Tayenty-fifth Day of March last, to promise and declare, (amongst other Things) That a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Scaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majesty's Service, who should, on or before the Thirty first Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, in Manner therein mentioned; which Bounties have been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this inftant July; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the fail Boun ies should contique to be paid to fuch Able and Ordinary Seamen for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Time limited for Payment of fich Bounties be prolonged and extended, and that the same do continue to be paid to every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit for His Majesty's Service, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall, on or before the Thirty-first Day of August next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Regulating Captains, or the Lieutenants employed under them, in London, or with the Captions or Lieutenants of any of His Majelly's Shi, s or Vesses of War: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves
