GEORGE R. THEREAS it hath been represented unto Us, that on the Eleventh Day of this instant Inly; a certain scandalous and seditious Paper was printed and published in the Town of Birmingham, and published in the Parts thereunto adjacent, in Our Counties of Warwick and Worcester, of the following Tenor: " My Coun-" trymen! The Second Year of Gallic Liberty is " nearly expired. At the Commencement of the "Third on the Fourteenth of this Month, it is " devoutly to be wished, that every Enemy to Civil " and Religious Despotism would give his Sanction " to the Majestic Common Cause, by a Public " Celebration of the Anniversary. Remember that " on the Fourteenth of July the Bastille, that high " Altar and Castle of Despetism, fell. Remember " the Enthusiasm, peculiar to the Cause of Liberty, with which it was attacked. Remember that " generous Humanity that taught the oppressed, " groaning under the Weight of infulted Rights, to " fave the Lives of Oppressors! Extinguish the " mean Prejudices of Nations; and let your Num-" bers be collected, and fent as a Free-will Offering " to the National Assembly. But is it possible to " forget that your own Parliament is venal! Your " Ministers hypocritical! Your Clergy legal Op-" pressors! The Reigning Family extravagant! " The Crown of a certain Great Personage be-" coming every Day too weighty for the Head that wears it! too weighty for the People who gave " it! Your Taxes partial and excessive-Your Re-

" of Property, Religion, and Freedom - But on the " Fourteenth of this Month, prove to the political " Sycophants of the Day that you reverence the " Olive Branch, that you will facrifice to Public "Tranquility, till the Majority shall exclaim, "The Peace of Slavery is worse than the War of " Freedom. - Of that Moment let Tyrants be-" ware !"-We, therefore, in order to bring to a speedy condiga Punishment the Publishers of the Paper aforefaid, and that Practices so highly dangerous to the Public Tranquillity and Welfare may hereafter be prevented, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and enjoining all Juffices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors; Bailiffs, Constables, and all other Our loving Subjects, to be aiding and affifting to the utmost of their Power in detecting, apprehending and bringing to Justice the Publishers of the Paper aforesaid: And, for the better Detection of the faid Publishers, We are graciously pleased to promise, that if any Person shall discover any other Person or Persons concerned in publishing the printed Paper aforesaid, by diffributing the same, or otherwise, so as the Person or Persons discovered may be brought to Justice for the same, such Discoverers shall have and receive as a Reward, upon Conviction of such Offender or Offenders, the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for each and every fuch Offender, and also Our gracious Pardon, in case the Person making such Discovery shall himself be liable to be prosecuted for the same, except the Person or Persons so discovering be the Author or Authors of the Paper aforefaid: And the Commissioners for executi g the Office of Treasurer of Our Exchequer are hereby

GOD Save the KING.

AT the Court at St. James's, the 29th Day of July, 1791,

E S E N. T. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS His Majetty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twenty-fifth Day of March last, to promise and declare, (amongst other Things) That a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Alle Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majesty's Service, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, in Manner therein ment oned; which Bounties have been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this instant July; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the faid Bounties should continue to be paid to such Able and Ordinary Seamen for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Time limited for Payment of fuch Eounties be prolonged and extended, and that the same do continue to be paid to every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit for His Majesty's Service, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall, on or before the Thirty first Day of August next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Regulating Captains, or the Lieutenants employed under them, in London, or with the Captains or Lieutenants of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vestels of War: Whereof all Persons con-

Ministerial Notes have been delivered at St. Petersburgh by Mr. Whitworth and Mr. Fawkener and Count Goltze, on the Part of His Majesty and of the King of Prussia, and by Count Osserman, on the Part of the Empress of Russia, relative to the Terms of Pacification between Russia and the Porte.

In these Notes, the Ministers of His Majesty and the King of Prussia agree, on the Part of Their respective Sovereigns, that Their Majesties will propose to the Porte to conclude a Peace with Russia on the Terms of the Cession of the District of Oczakow, from the Bog to the Dniester; Her Imperial Majesty engaging not to disturb the free Navigation of the latter River, but to favor and protect it; (to which Condition the Porte is to be equally and reciprocally bound:) And Her Imperial Majesty being also to restore to the Porte, at the Conclusion of the Peace, all other Conquests whatever. The Minister of Her Imperial Majesty agrees, on the

Part of his Sovereign, to make Peace on these Terms; and the Ministers of His Majesty and the King of Prussia agree, on the Part of their respective Sovereigns, that, if the Porte should decline to enter into Negociation on this Basis, Their Majesties will leave the Termination of the War to the Course of those Events to which it may lead.
