The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty, by Order in Council of the 10th Day of June, 1791, was pleased to declare, That so much of the Regulations respectively contained in each and every of the Orders in Council therein mentioned as were in Force and Effect till the 10th Day of June, 1791, respecting the Importation of the several Articles of Grain mentioned in the said Orders, should continue in Force to all Intents and Purposes until the 15th Day of November, 1791, in Manner therein mentioned: And whereas Doubts have arisen whether the special Permission given by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 5th Day of January, 1791, to import Foreign Rye and Rye-Meal on the low Duties, notwithstanding His Majesty's Order in Council of the 13th of October, 1790, and also the special Permission given by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 23d of March, 1791, to import Foreign Wheat and Wheat-Meal at the low Duties, notwithstanding any previous Orders of His Majesty in Council, may not be respectively interpreted, so as to admit of the Importation on the low Duties of Foreign Rye and Rye-Meal, and Foreign Wheat and Wheat-Meal, though the Prices of British Rye or Wheat shall have already fallen, or should, before the 15th Day of November next, fall below the Average Prices per Quarter at and above which the

Ports of this Kingdom would be open for the Importation on the low Duties of these Articles respectively, according to the said Order in Council of the 13th Day of October, 1790:—His Majesty, to obviate such Doubts, is hereby pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, That as the Average Price of Rye appears by the Accounts published in the London Gazette by the Receiver of Corn Returns, from the Returns made to him, to be under Thirty-two Shillings per Quarter, the Ports of this Kingdom shall be shut against the Importation upon the low Duties of Foreign Rye and Rye-Meal, at the End of Six Days after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, and that the said Ports shall, in like Manner, be shut against the Importation on the low Duties of Foreign Wheat and Wheat-Meal, and also of all other Articles of Grain mentioned in the said Order in Council of the 13th of October, 1790, at the End of Six Days after that the Average Price of each of the said Articles respectively shall have appeared, or shall appear by the Accounts published in the London Gazette by the Receiver of Corn Returns, as before mentioned, to be under the Prices at and above which the Ports were open for the Importation of each of the said Articles respectively, at the low Duties, as directed by the said Order in Council of the 13th of October, 1790.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
