W Hereas it has been represented to the Commissioners of His Majefly's Cuftons, that on the 25th of August last, Thomas Hall, Surveyor of the Customs at the Islands of Scilly, having received Information of a Smuggling Vessel called the Friendship, of Pen-zance, belonging to James Dunkin, and commanded by George Branwell, wount out in his Boat in Search of ber, and about Ten o'Clock at Night fell in with how in all Common Harbour near the Hand of Trefon her in old Grimfby Harbour, near the Island of Trefco; her in old Grimfoy Harbour, near the Island of Trejco; and that on his rowing toward the faid Veffel for the Purpofe of boarding her, a Perfon from the Deck hailed, and afked, "What Boat is that?" and upon the faid Hall's anfowering, "The Cuffom Boat," Two Muskets or Blunderbuffes were immediately fired by the faid. James Dunkin into the faid Boat, by which William Millett and John Oliver, Two of the Boatmen in the faid Custom-House Boat, where killed, and John Jane, another of the Boatmen, dangeroufly wounded: And whereas the Cororer's Inquest having fat on the Bodies of the faid William Millett and John Oliver, have brought in their Verdiet Wilful Murder against the faid James Dunkin or others on whom he had waft Influence.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this most atrocious Offence, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the faid Offenders, who shall Pardon to any one of the faid Offenders, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices (except the faid James Dunkin, or any other Person who actually fired) so that any one or more of them may be appre-bended and convicted of the Offence. General Post-Office, Monday, September 19, 1791. MAIL ROBBERY and MURDER.

ON Thurfday the 15th Inftant, about Five o'Clock in the Morning, James Hogworth, the Post-Boy, carrying the Mail from Warrington to Manchesster, was murdered about a Mile from Warrington: The Mail was found open, and the Letters in the following Bags were taken out and carried away, viz. the Bags from Chefter for Manchefter and Rochdale, which contained the Letters of the 10th from Ireland for those Towns and Places beyond, and the Bags from Liver-pool and Warrington for Rochdale.

Two Men (supposed from their Accent to be Irishmen) were seen near the Place where the Robbery and Murder was committed immediately afterwards, and were, about Six o'Clock the fame Morning, feen a Mile and a Half from Warrington on the Road to Liverpool. They were about Five Feet Five Inches high; one dreffed in a firait-bodied afb-coloured Coat, the other in a firiped Great Coat, with a large Cape, and each carried a fmall Bundle.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the Person or Persons who committed this Robbery and Murder, will be entitled to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen; or if any Perfon or Perfons, whether an Accomplice in the Robbery and Munder, (except the Perfon or Perfons who actually committed the Murder) shall make Difcovery, whereby

the Perfon or Perfons who committed the fame, may be apprebended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer will, upon Conviction of the Party or Parties, be en-titled to the same Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, and will also receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon.
