

Warfaw, September 7. A few Days fince the Bailli de Cuber had an Audience of His Polish Majesty, and prefented to him his Credentials as Envoy Extraordinary and Minifter Plenipotentiary from the Court of Madrid, in the Room of M. de Normandez.

Vienna, September 7. The Ratifications of the Treaty of Peace, and of the Convention between His Imperial Majefty and the Ottoman Porte, were exchanged on the 23d Ultimo, at Sistovo, by the Austrian and Turkish Ple-nipotentiaries, in due Form. And on the 5th In-

ftant Sir Robert Murray Keith, His Britannick Majesty's Plenipotentiary at the above Congress, returned to this City.

Paris, September 14. This Morning His Most Christian Majesty came to the National Affembly in his State Coach, attended by His Minifters, and having taken the Oath pre-feribed by the new Conffitution, He returned to the Palace of the Thuilleries, through the Garden, on Foot, attended by the Members of the Affembly.

A general Illumination and other Rejoicings have taken Place throughout the City on the Occafion.
