A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS certain evil-minded Persons did, on the Morning of the Twenty-eighth Day of July last, set Fire to the Out-Houses of Mr. James. Wheat, of Norwood-Hall, in Our County of York; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish and declare Our Resolution that the Authors, Abettors and Perpetrators of the said Offence be prosecuted as speedily as may be, according to the due Course of Law: And We do hereby enjoin and require all Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Constables, and all Our loving Subjects, to be aiding and assisting, to the utmost of their Power, in detecting, apprehending and bringing to Justice the said Offenders: And We are graciously pleased to promise, that if any Person shall discover any other Person or Persons who were guilty of the said Offence, so as the Person or Persons discovered may be prosecuted for the same, such Discoverer shall have as a Reward ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for each and every such Offender, and also Our gracious Pardon for the said Offence, in case the Person making such Discovery shall himself be liable to be prosecuted for the same.

Given at Our Court at Weymouth, the Twenty-eighth Day of September, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-one, in the Thirty-first Year of Our Reign.
