# Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Gicat Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cafe of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending fhall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Dobt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Ession, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majelly's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

-If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he fhall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain fhall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Empoyment, and be incapable of any Employment ander His Majefty.

If any Officer of the Cultoms in Great Britain; or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he fhall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the fame.

### Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefly.

BY thefe Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatfoever, ufed in or proper for the working or finithing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Poffefinon of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cuftom-houfe Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils ufed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.

# Whitehall; October 5, 1791.

W Hereas it bas been reprefented to the Commiffioners of His Majesty's Customs, That on Tuesday the 16th of August last, the Dolphin Revenue Cutter, Richard John Commander, stationed at the Port of St. Ive's, fell in with a large armed Smuggling Lugger near Padstow, in the County of Cornwall, when the Smugglers feloniously fired a Shot at the Dolphin; brought her to, and immediately ordered Mr. Ormond, the Mate of the Cutter, on Board, who found her navigated with about Fifty Men, all armed ready for Action, having Eight Six-Pounders mounted, with as many more in the Hold, and pierced for Eighteen Guns:

Hold, and pierced for Eighteen Guns: His Majefly, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Felony and Outrage, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One or more of the faid Offenders, who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, (except the Master or Commander of the faid Lugger, or the Person who astually fired) so that One or more of them may be apprehended and convicted of the faid Offence.
