As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; the follow-ing Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Mujesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or infrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Inframents used by them, as well as to the Artifi-cers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and fhall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Weftminfter, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he fhall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Arti-ficers, fhall go into any Country out of His Mancers, mail go into any Country out of His Ma-jefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's. Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassfador, Minister or Conful of Great Bri-tis in the Country where such Artificare shall be tain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambasfador,

henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perforts hall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vise or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majelty's Ule, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Juffice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpofes aforefaid, such Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Julkice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sef-fions: And, if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Juffice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he fhall he delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Geat Britain, and shall be convicted, upon In-&c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from dictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Weltminster,

Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in Eng-&c. land, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indiciment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED FOUNDS, and thall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in Cale of a fublequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Ession, &c. shall be allowed.

It fhall be lawful for any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majelly's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer fhall find on Board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized fhall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the beft Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce fhall be to the Ufe of His Majefty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who fhall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he fhall, for every fuch Offence, forfeitONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain fhall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but thall alfo forfeit his Empoyment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majelly.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he fhall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefly. BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to

Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatfoever, uled in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Poffeffion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreiga Parts, and all Cuftom-houfe Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
