#### Copenhagen, October 25.

In the Month of June last it was made known, that a dangerous Shoal had been difcovered in the Cattegat, between the Island of Anholt and the Town of Warberg in Sweden. The Court of Admiralty has now given Orders to the Keeper of the Royal Records of Sea Charts, that the faid Shoal (upon which is found only Nineteen Feet of Water, with a large ftony or rocky Bottom) shall be immediately engraved upon the Plate of the Survey of the Cat-tegat for 1790, and there laid down exactly agreeable to the Report of His Danish Majesty's Officers appointed this Summer to furvey these Grounds.

It is further found, by the exact Surveys lately made, that the Island of Anholt and Anholt Reef are fituated near One and One-third of an English League more to the Eastward, in the fame Latitude, than they are laid down in the aforefaid Charts of 1790. This Error will be corrected in the new Charts.

It is alfo faid, that the Shoal in Queftion lies E. N. E. from Anholt Light-Houfe, and at about Twenty English Miles Distance from it.
