The Count de Lerena, Minister of the Finance Department, having been much indisposed for some Time past, His Catholick Majesty has been pleased to dispense with his Services 'till his Health shall be re-established; and the Business of his Office will be conducted, ad interim, by Don Diego Gardoqui, One of the Chief Directors of Finance for the Indian Department, and formerly His Catholick Majesty's Consul-General in London.

Copenhagen, October 25.

In the Month of June last it was made known, that a dangerous Shoal had been discovered in the Cattegat, between the Island of Anholt and the Town of Warberg in Sweden. The Court of Admiralty has now given Orders to the Keeper of the Royal Records of Sea Charts, that the said Shoal (upon which is found only Nineteen Feet of Water, with a large stony or rocky Bottom) shall be immediately engraved upon the Plate of the Survey of the Cattegat for 1790, and there laid down exactly agreeable to the Report of His Danish Majesty's Officers appointed this Summer to survey these Grounds.

It is further found, by the exact Surveys lately made, that the Island of Anholt and Anholt Reef are situated near One and One-third of an English League more to the Eastward, in the same Latitude, than they are laid down in the aforesaid Charts of 1790. This Error will be corrected in the new Charts.

It is also said, that the Shoal in Question lies E. N. E. from Anholt Light-House, and at about Twenty English Miles Distance from it.

Hague, November 1.

Their Royal and Serene Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Orange arrived on Saturday the 29th Ult. at their House in the Wood, together with the Hereditary Prince of Orange and his Brother Prince Frederic, the Hereditary Princess of Orange, and the Prince and Princess of Brunswick; and this Day they will all make their Public Entry into the Hague: After which the Rejoicings will begin in Honor of the Marriage of the Hereditary Prince.
