#### Dublin Castle, November 5.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of the Birth of the late King William the Third, of Glorious Memory, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower; at Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Dislinction at the Castle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant; after which his Excellency, attended by the Nobility and Gentry, and efforted by a Squadron of Horfe, went in Procession round the Statue of King William. On his Excellency's Return to the Castle the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majestry's Park the Phœnix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in College Green. And at Night there were Bonsires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Joy.

W Hereas it has been bumbly reprefented to the King, that, upon the 20th of October last, as His Majefly's Excife Cutter the Badger was cruizing between Black Coombe and the Ifle of Man, she fell in with a large Smuggling Lugger, when a warm Engagement enfued between the Badger and the faid Lugger, wherein Mr. Daniel Stewart, the Master Surveyor, was shot through the Shoulder, Richard Martley, the Cook, through both Legs, and others of the Crew flightly wounded; and after the faid Lugger, from her fuperior Force, had driven the Badger's People from their Guns and Decks, and had prevented their Escape by keeping up a conflant Fire upon her, and disabled her Maft and Rigging, she bailed the Badger, and ordered her to send the Boat on Board the Lugger, or that they would fink the Gutter; and the Boat being accordingly fent, fhe foon returned to the Badger with Six or Eight of the Lug-ger's People in her, who fent Mr. Inglis, Mate of the Badger, and Three of her Men, on Board the Lugger, and then cut away the Badger's Masts, and cut ber Sails from the Yards, threw her Great Guns and Small Arms over-board, and plundered the Badger of her Stores, and the Master Surveyor and Mate of their Clothes, Watches, Money, and other their private Property, with all which they returned to the faid Lugger, and then gave the Mate and People of the Badger (aubom they had before fent on Board her) their Choice. of being thrown over-board, or going again in the fmall Boat

Boat to the Badger, which, from a heavy Gale of Wind that had then come on, there was little Probability of their reaching, but they providentially effected it, and the Badger is fince returned a perfect Wreck to the Ifle of Man :

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above daring Acts of Violence and Piracy, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to fuch of them as may give Information against one or more of their Accomplices, except the Master and Mate of the faid Lugger, and excepting all those Perfons who actually went in the Lugger's Boat on Board the Badger and plundered her as aforefaid, fo that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
