YESTERDAY John Hopkins, Esq; Lord Mayor Elect for the Year ensuing, was sworn at Guildhall; when the Chair and other Ensigns of Mayoralty were surrendered to him in the accustomed Manner.

This Day the new Lord Mayor, accompanied by the late Lord Mayor, the Aldermen, Recorder and Sheriffs, in their Scarlet Gowns, went in their Coaches to the Water-side, the Sword and Mace being carried before them, and the City Officers attending; and from thence proceeded in the City Barge, attended by the several Companies in their respective Barges, adorned with Streamers and Pendants, to Westminster; and having walked round the Hall, and solemnly saluted all the Courts, they went to the Exchequer Bar, and the new Lord Mayor did there take the Oaths appointed; and having recorded Warrants of Attorney in the proper Courts, returned by Water to Black Friars, and from thence in Coaches, with the usual Solemnity, to Guildhall, where a magnificent Entertainment was provided; at which were present several of the Foreign Ministers, the Great Officers of State, divers of the Nobility, Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, the Judges, and many other Persons of Quality and Distinction.

Dublin Castle, November 5.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of the Birth of the late King William the Third, of Glorious Memory, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower; at Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant; after which his Excellency, attended by the Nobility and Gentry, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse, went in Procession round the Statue of King William. On his Excellency's Return to the Castle the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in College Green. And at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Joy.

Yesterday Evening Intelligence was received here, by M. de Bulgakow, the Russian Minister to this Court, of the Death of Prince Potemkin, which happened at Yassy on the 16th Instant.

Whitehall, November 11, 1791.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, upon the 20th of October last, as His Majesty's Excise Cutter the Badger was cruising between Black Coombe and the Isle of Man, she fell in with a large Smuggling Luggar, when a warm Engagement ensued between the Badger and the said Luggar, wherein Mr. Daniel Stewart, the Master Surveyor, was shot through the Shoulder, Richard Martley, the Cook, through both Legs, and others of the Crew slightly wounded; and after the said Luggar, from her superior Force, had driven the Badger's People from their Guns and Decks, and had prevented their Escape by keeping up a constant Fire upon her, and disabled her Mast and Rigging, she hailed the Badger, and ordered her to send the Boat on Board the Luggar, or that they would sink the Cutter; and the Boat being accordingly sent, she soon returned to the Badger with Six or Eight of the Luggar's People in her, who sent Mr. Inglis, Mate of the Badger, and Three of her Men, on Board the Luggar, and then cut away the Badger's Masts, and cut her Sails from the Yards, threw her Great Guns and Small Arms over-board, and plundered the Badger of her Stores, and the Master Surveyor and Mate of their Clothes, Watches, Money, and other their private Property, with all which they returned to the said Luggar, and then gave the Mate and People of the Badger (whom they had before sent on Board her) their Choice of being thrown over-board, or going again in the small Boat

Boat to the Badger, which, from a heavy Gale of Wind that had then come on, there was little Probability of their reaching, but they providentially effected it, and the Badger is since returned a perfect Wreck to the Isle of Man:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above daring Acts of Violence and Piracy, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to such of them as may give Information against one or more of their Accomplices, except the Master and Mate of the said Lugger, and excepting all those Persons who actually went in the Lugger's Boat on Board the Badger and plundered her as aforesaid, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
