#### Constantinople, October 8.

The Grand Fleet returned into Harbour the 29th Ultimo, when the Captain Pashaw received a distinguished Mark of the Sultan's Satisfaction. A few Ships of War only continue at the Entrance of the Canal, to wait the Return of the Flotilla from Varna; and the Cruizers in the Archipelago have received Orders to return into Port.

The Plague, though visibly diminished, still continues in this Residence. Advices from Smyrna mention, that they had begun there, on the 1st Instant, to give clean Bills of Health.
