TO OWNERS AND MASTERS OF FISHING VESSELS.

Marine Society's Office, December 1, 1791.

THE Marine Society, being appointed by an Act of the last Sessions of Parliament to the Trust of receiving the Duties and enforcing the Regulations of the annexed Extract of the Acts of Parliament of the Twenty-ninth and Thirty-third of George the Second, think it their Duty to make them as public as

possible, that the Owners and Masters of all Fishing Ships, Sloops, Smacks, or other Vessels, may be acquainted with the Regulations to which they are required to conform, and which the Governors of this Society have resolved to enforce to the utmost of their Power.

The Master, Owner, Chief Officer, or Mariner of any Fishing Ship, Sloop, Smack, or Fishing Vessel, coming from Sea, or other Part having the Conduct of any Fishing Ship, &c. Natives or Foreigners, employed either in catching, bringing or vending of Fish for the Supply of the Cities of London and Westminster, who shall break Bulk or make Sale of their Fish, or any Part thereof, between Harwich and the Nore, or between Margate and the Nore, to any Person or Persons to sell again, and shall be convicted thereof, the Ship and Cargo shall be forfeited.

The Master, &c. of any Fishing Ship, &c. shall, within Three Days after Arrival at the Nore with any Fish, truly report the Time of Arrival to the Clerk in the Coast Office, London, who shall make an Entry and grant a Certificate thereof, for which Two Shillings shall be paid.

Fifty Pounds Penalty on Neglect to make the Entry.

At the Time of making the Report, a true Account to be left of all fresh Salmon, Salmon Trouts, Turbot and large fresh Cod, and half fresh Cod-Fish, Haddock, Scate Fish, Fresh Ling, Lobsters, Soles and Whittings, brought alive to the Nore.

Fifty Pounds Forfeit on Refusal or Neglect.

If any Master, &c. or any other Person on board, shall (after Arrival at the Nore) wilfully destroy or throw away any Fish brought from the Sea that is not unwholesome, perished or unmarketable;

Such Master, &c. shall be committed to the House of Correction.

No Live Salmon, &c. to be removed out of the Vessel in which it is brought to the Nore into any Well-Boat or Store-Boat, on Penalty of Fifty Pounds.

Twelve Days are allowed for the Sale of Lobsters and Eight Days for the Sale of all other Fish on board any such Fishing Vessels, to be reckoned from the Day of Arrival at the Nore.
