Caserta, November 15.

Melancholy Accounts have been received here of the Earthquakes in Calabria Ultra, which have been frequent and violent for Six Weeks past. They do not seem to extend so far as in the Year 1783, and their greatest Force appears to have been at Monte-Leone, Mileto, and Soriano, where most of the wooden Barracks have been overthrown, and many People wounded, but few Lives have been loft.

These Earthquakes are but slightly felt at Messina; and it has been remarked that fince they began, Mount Etna and Stromboli have been quiet and fmoked less than usual. A Village called Case Nuove, near Fuligno, on the Loretto Road, was nearly destroyed by an Earthquake the 11th of October, and the Houses for Six Miles round were damaged more or less, the People being obliged to live in the Fields.

Mount Vesuvius, after having thrown out a thick Smoke and Ashes for several Days, opened a new Mouth on the Side next to the Mountain of Somma on Thursday last, and from thence a copious Lava is running into the Valley between the Two Mountains.
