THE King has been pleased to grant to the Reverend William Cookson, Bachelor in Divinity, the Dignity of a Prebend of the Free Chapel of St. George, in His Majesty's Castle of Windsor, void by the Resignation of the Reverend Doctor Jonathan Davies.
