Commissions signed by His Majesty for the Army in Ireland.

FIFTH Regiment of Dragoons, Lieutenant Stephen Mahon, from 14th Dragoons, to be Captain, vice Earl of Eroll, removed to 58th Foot. Dated November 30, 1791.

51st Regiment of Foot, Captain William Fitch, from 58th Foot, to be Major, vice Knollis, resigned. Dated as above.
