Berlin, January 3.

The King of Great Britain having been graciously pleased to nominate Merton Eden, Esq; his Envoy-Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at this Court, to be a Knight Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath; and His Majesty being desirous that he should be knighted and invested with the Ensigns of the Order in the most distinguished Manner, Mr. Eden presented a Letter from the King his Master, requesting that His Prussian Majesty would be pleased to represent His Britannick Majesty on this Occasion. His Prussian Majesty consented with the utmost Readiness, and with many cordial Professions of Friendship towards His Britannick Majesty, and appointed Sunday the 1st Instant, at Eleven o'Clock, for the Ceremony.

Mr. Eden repaired to the Palace at the Hour appointed, and was received by Count Finckenstein, one of the Ministers for Foreign Affairs, and the Great Chamberlain, Prince Sacken. Soon after the folding Doors of the Audience Chamber were thrown open, and Mr. Eden was introduced by Count Finckenstein. His Majesty was standing under the Canopy of State; on his Right Hand stood the Prince Royal of Prussia, and Two of his Brothers, and also His Majesty's Uncle, Prince Ferdinand, with his Two Sons; on the Left were the Chief Officers of State and of the Household, and General Mollendorff, Governor of Berlin, with some of the principal General Officers. Mr. Eden approached His Majesty with Three Bows, and turning to the Prince Royal and the other Princes, made them likewise a respectful Bow. The King then addressed Mr. Eden, and told him, that, at the Request and in the Name of his

his Sovereign, he was going to knight him, and invest him with the Ensigns of the Order of the Bath. His Majesty then ordered him to kneel, and putting on his Hat, drew his Sword, which His Majesty laid first on Mr. Eden's Left Shoulder, then on his Right, and then on his Left again, saying each Time, "Soyez bon et loyal Chevalier au Nom de Dieu." M. de Marwitz, Marshal of the Court, then presented to His Majesty, on a Velvet Cushion, the Ribbon and Star. His Majesty put the Ribbon over Sir Morton Eden's Right Shoulder, and the Star on his Left Breast, and, being thus invested, Sir Morton rose up, and expressed his respectful Sense of this distinguished Mark of his Sovereign's Approbation, the Value of which, he said, was greatly enhanced by the very honourable and flattering Manner in which it had been conferred upon him. His Prussian Majesty made a very gracious Reply, and Sir Morton then withdrew from the Royal Presence with the same Ceremony as at his Entrance.

STATE LOTTERY.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, Jan. 12, 1792.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties think it necessary, at this Period, thus publicly to caution all Persons against buying or selling any Shares of Tickets in the ensuing State Lottery, other than such as are legally stamped, or PUBLISHING, IN ANY MANNER, PROPOSALS for such Purpose; the Act having prohibited, under large Penalties,

the dealing in CHANCES, under any Pretence or Device whatsoever, which may depend on the Contingency of drawing the said Tickets; and a recent Judgment, in the Court of King's Bench, having determined, that the Prohibition against PUBLISHING ILLEGAL PROPOSALS applies not only to the Projectors of them, but extends also to the Publishers of Newspapers, of Hand-Bills, or any other Communication of such Proposals.
