The continued and progreffive Improvement in the internal Situation of the Country will, I am confident, animate you in the Purfuit of every Meafure which may be conducive to the Public Intereft. It muft, at the fame Time, operate as the ftrongeft Encouragement to a Spirit of ufeful Industry among all Claffes of My Subjects, and, above all, muft confirm and increase their steady and zealous Attachment to that Constitution, which we have found, by long Experience, to unite the inestimable Bleffings of Liberty and Order, and to which, under the Favor of Providence, all Our other Advantages are principally to be ascribed.
