That upon the Statements delivered in by the Petitioners, the faid Select Committee have determined, " That " the Right of Election for the City and Liberty of "Westminster is in the Inhabitants, Householders " paying Scot and Lot, within the united Parishes of St. Margaret and St. John, and the several " Parishes of St. Paul Covent Garden, St. Ann,

"St. James, St. George Hanover Square, in the Liberty of St. Martin-le-Grand in the County " of Middlesex, and in so much of the Parishes of St. Martin in the Fields, St. Clement " Danes, and St. Mary le Strand, as are not within "any of the Four Wards of the Liberty of the Duchy of Lancaster." I do hereby give Notice, that the House has appointed Wednesday the Eighteenth Day of April next, to take the faid Petition into Confideration, at the same Time that the Petition of the feveral Persons whose Names are thereunto subscribed, Electors of Members to ferve in Parliamen for the City and Liberty of West. minster is ordered to be taken into Consideration.
