THIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to.

An Act for granting an Aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax, to be raised in Great Britain, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-two.

An Act for continuing and granting to His Majesty certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cyder and Perry, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-two.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Marine Forces while on Shore.

An Act for repealing the Duties on Female Servants.

An Act to repeal the Duties on certain inhabited Houses containing less than Seven Windows or Lights, granted by an Act of the Sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty.

An Act for repealing the Duties on Waggons, Wains, Carts and other Carriages, granted by an Act of the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty.

An Act for continuing and amending an Act of the Seventh Year of His present Majesty, for amending the Road from the End of the Town Close, in the County of the City of Norwich, to the Chalk Pits near Thetford, in the County of Norfolk.

An Act for continuing and amending an Act of the Tenth Year of His present Majesty, for amending and widening the Road from St. Benedict's Gate, in the County of the City of Norwich, to Swaffham, in the County of Norfolk, and from Halfpenny Bridge, in Honingham, to the Bounds of Yaxham; and also a Lane called Hangman's Lane, near the Gates of the said City.

And to One Private Bill.

THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarne, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act for repealing the Duties upon Malt granted by an Act made in the Thirty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for granting to His Majesty additional Duties upon Malt.

An Act for repealing a certain Part of the Duty upon all Candles (except Wax and Spermaceti Candles.)
