Election to be in the Mayor, Bailiffs and Burgeses, or Freemen whose Place of Residence at the Time of their giving their Votes is in the said Borough, or who, at such Time, have no Place of Residence elsewhere, and who have never been absent from the Borough for the Space of a Year and a Day without Interruption since they were admitted to the Freedom thereof, or whose Families (if they were Masters of Families) have not been absent for the Space of Time aforesaid without Interruption after the Time of the Admission of such Burgeses or Freemen, having Families, to the Freedom of the said Borough." That the Counsel for the Sitting Members Sir Archibald Macdonald, Kut. and the Hon. John Leveson Gower, delivered in a Statement as follows: "The Right of Election is in Freemen residing in the Borough of Newcastle, and not receiving Alms, or Church Bread: Persons living a Year and a Day out of the Borough lose their Freedom." That upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the said Petitioners the said Select Committee have determined, "That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is not the Right of Election for the said Borough of Newcastle under Lyne." That upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the Sitting Members the said Select Committee have determined, "That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is not the Right of Election for the said Borough of Newcastle under Lyne." That the said Select Committee having duly considered the said Statements, and the Evidence adduced before them touching the Right of Election, have determined, "That the Right of Election is in Freemen residing in the said Borough of Newcastle under Lyne." That upon the said Statement the said Select Committee have determined, "That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is not the Right of Election for the said Town and Port of Seaford." That the Counsel for the said Petitioners, Sir Godfrey Webster, Baronet, and John Tarleton, Esquire, delivered in a Statement as follows: "The Counsel for the Petitioners state, that the Right of Election for the said Town and Port of Seaford, according as the same was decided by the last Determination in the House of Commons on the 10th of February, 1670-1, is "in the Populacy," or, according to the Interpretation of the Word "Populacy" by the Resolution of the said House on the 15th of December, 1761, in the Inhabitants Housekeepers of the said Town and Port, paying Scot and Lot, and in such Inhabitants Housekeepers only." That upon the said last mentioned Statement the said Select Committee have determined, "That the Right of Election is in the Inhabitants, Housekeepers of the said Town and Port, paying Scot and Lot, and in such Inhabitants Housekeepers only."
