" Election to be in the Mayor, Bailiffs and Burgesses, or Freemen whose Place of Residence at the Time of their giving their Votes is in the faid Borough, or who, at fuch Time, have no Place of Residence elsewhere, and who have never been absent from the Borough for the Space of a Year and a Day without Interruption fince they were admitted to the Freedom thereof, or whole Families (if they were Masters of Families) have not been absent for the Space of Time aforesaid without Interruption after the Time of the Admission of such "Burgesses or Freemen, having Families, to the Freedom of the said Borough." That the Counsel for the Sitting Members Sir Archibald Macdonald, Kut. and the Hon. John Leveson Gower, delivered in a Statement as follows: "The Right of Election " is in Freemen reliding in the Borough of New-" castle, and not receiving Alms, or Church Bread:

"Persons living a Year and a Day out of the Bo"rough lose their Freedom." That upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the said Petitioners the said Select Committee have determined, That the Right of Election, as let forth in the " faid Statement, is not the Right of Election for the faid Borough of Newcastle under Lyne." That upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the Sitting Members the faid Select Committee have determined, " That the Right of Election, as fet forth in the faid Statement, is not the Right " of Election for the faid Borough of Newcastle under Lyne." That the faid Select Committee having duly confidered the faid Statements, and the Evidence adduced before them touching the Right of Election, have determined, " That the Right of "Election is in Freemen refiding in the faid Borough of Newcastle under Lyne."
