Much hurt has been lately done by the Snow, particularly in the Vally of Sina in the Cantons, where three Villages have been covered with Snow, by the violence of the Wines blown upon them, under which, above 100 persons perished, with a great number of Cattle. And in the Grisons near Gampohlia, so great a quantity of Snow was blown into the River, that the current being stopt, so sudden an Inundation immediately softward, that several houses were mined, eight persons drowned, with some thousands of Cattle.

The Duke of Savoy has ordered all his Boats to be fitted up, which with the forces ordered to march towards Geneva, has much allarward the City, where they continue their Fortifications with much labor and expence, little hopes as yet appearing of the composure of their differences.

Venice, Febr. 20.
