An Act for enlarging and altering the Terms and Powers of Two Acts of Parliament, made and passed in the Eighteenth and Twenty-second Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, for repairing the High Road leading from Boroughbridge, in the County of York, through Northallerton in the same County to Croft Bridge on the River Tees, and from thence through Darlington, in the County of Durham, to the City of Durham, and for reducing the said Acts into One, and for the more effectually repairing and keeping in Repair the said Road.

An Act for amending, widening and keeping in Repair the several Roads or Branches of Road leading from the Parishes of Yoxford, Saxmundham and Benhall, in the County of Suffolk, to the Town of Aldeburgh in the said County.

The Ladies to wear Black Silk or Velvet, coloured Ribbons, Fans and Tippetts, or plain White, or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuffs, with Black Ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear Black Coats, and Black or plain White, or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuff Waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured Swords and Buckles.

And on Thursday the 12th of April, the Court to go out of Mourning.
