R The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS by an A& made in the Twentythird Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, " An Act for preventing certain " Instruments from being required from Ships " belonging to the United States of America; " and to give to His Majesty, for a limited " Time, certain Powers for the better carrying " on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects " of His Majefty's Dominions and the Inhabitants " of the faid United States ;" which faid Act has been continued by feveral subsequent Acts until the 5th. Day of April, 1792. And whereas by an Act made in the Twenty-fourth Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An A& to extend the " Powers of an Act, made in the Twenty-third Year " of the Reign of His present Majesty, for giving " His Majefty certain Powers for the better carrying " on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of " His Majefty's Dominions and the Inhabitants " of the United States of America, to the Trade ** and Commerce of this Kingdom with the Britifh " Colonies and Plantations in America, with Re-" fpeft to certain Articles therein mentioned," the Powers given by the faid recited Act were extended to the Trade and Intercourfe between this Kingdom and the British Colonies and Plantations

A^T the Court at St. James's, the 4th of April, in America, fo far as the fame might relate to Iron, Hemp and Sailcloth, and other Articles of the Produce of any Place bordering on the Baltic, which might be exported from this Kingdom; which last mentioned Act has also by feveral fubfequent Acts been continued until the faid 5th Day of April, 1792.

> And whereas by another Act passed in this prefent Sellion of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to continue " the Laws now in Force for regulating the Trade be-" tween the Subjects of His Majefty's Dominions, " and the Inhabitants of the Territories belonging " to the United States of America, fo far as the " fame relate to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom and the Inhabitants " of the Countries belonging to the faid United " States," it is declared to be expedient, that the faid Act of the Twenty-third Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, fo far only as the fame extends to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom and the People and Territories belonging to the United States of America, and also that the faid Act of the Twenty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, should be further continued and be in Force; and it is thereby enacted, that the faid Acts hall continue and he in Force until the 5th Day of April, 1793, and to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament.
