That upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the Sitting Members, the said Select Committee reported, that they had determined, "That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is the Right of Election for the said Borough of Pontefract." That John Walsh, Esquire, and also several other Persons pretending to be Electors of Representatives to serve in Parliament for the said Borough of Pontefract, having presented their respective Petitions to this House to prevent the said Judgment of the said Select Committee from becoming final and conclusive, praying that they might be admitted as Parties, according to the Form of the Statute in that Case made and provided, to oppose that Right of Election, in Favour of which the said Select Committee had reported as above set forth, and that they respectively might have such further and other Relief in the Premises as to the House should seem meet, and the Nature of their Case might require. And the Petitioners humbly insisting, that the Right of Election, which hath been deemed valid in the Judgment of the said Select Committee, is the ancient and true Right of Election for the said Borough of Pontefract, the Petitioners therefore pray that they may be admitted as Parties to defend such Right of Election, so reported to this House as aforesaid, according to the Form of the said Statute, and that they may have such further and other Relief as to the House shall seem meet, and as the Nature of their Case may require. At the Lent Assizes, 1792, for the County of Cambridge, an Indictment was found by the Grand Jury against Spence Broughton and John Oxley for robbing the Cambridge Mail, near Bourn Bridge, on the 9th of June last; and at the same Assizes for the County of York an Indictment was likewise found against them for robbing the Mail between Sheffield and Rotherham on the 29th of January, 1791; on which last Indictment Broughton was tried and convicted.

Oxley escaped out of Clerkenwell Bridewell on the 31st of October last.

He is about Twenty-five Years of Age, Five Feet Ten Inches high; pale faced, rather pitted with the Small Pox, and his Nose turned a little to the Right.

Whoever shall secure the said John Oxley, and lodge him in any of the Goals of this Kingdom, within Three Months from the Date hereof, will be entitled to a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be paid immediately on his Commitment.
