AT the Lent Assizes, 1792, for the County of Cambridge, an Indicatment was found by the Grand Jury against Spence Broughton and John Oxley for robbing the Cambridge Mail, near Bourn B. dge, on the 9th of June last; and at the same Assizes for the County of York an Indictment was likewife found against them for robbing the Mail between Sheffield and Rotheram on the 29th of January, 1791; on which last Indictment Broughton was tried and convicted.

Oxley escaped out of Clerkenwell Bridewell on the 31st of October last.

He is about Twenty-five Years of Age, Five Fect Ten Inches high, pale faced, rather pitted with the Small Pox, and his Nose turned a little to the Right.
