By the KING, A PROCLAMATION. GEORGE R.

HEREAS divers wicked and feditious Writings have been printed, published, and industriously difperfed, tending to excite Tumult and Diforder, by endeavouring to saife groundless Jealoufies and Difcontents in the Minds of Our faithful and loving Subjects, respecting the Laws and happy Constitution of Government, Civil and Religious, established in this Kingdom ; and endeavouring to vilify and bring into Contempt the wife and wholefome Provisions made at the Time of the Glorious Revolution, and fince ftrengthened and confirmed by fublequent Laws for the Prefervation and Security of the Rights and Liberties of Our faithful and loving Subjects : And whereas divers Writings have also been printed, published and industriously dispersed, recommending the faid wicked and feditious Publications to the Attention of all Our faithful and loving Subjects : And whereas we have also Reason to believe that Correspondencies have been entered into with fundry Perfons in Foreign Parts, with a View to forward the criminal and wicked Purpofes above mentioned. And whereas the Wealth, Happinels and Prosperity of this Kingdom do, under Divine Providence, chiefly depend upon a due Submiffion to the Laws, a just Confidence in the Integrity and Wifdom of Parliament, and a Continuance of that zealous Attachment to the Government and Conftitution of the Kingdom, which has ever prevailed in the Minds of the People thereof : And whereas there is nothing

which We fo earneftly defire as to fecure the Publick Peace and Profperity, and to preferve to all Our loving Subjects the full Enjoyment of their Rights and Liberties, both Religious and Civil : We, therefore, being refolved, as far as in Us lies, to reprefs the wicked and feditious Practices aforefaid, and to deter all Perfons from following fo pernicious an Example, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our; Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, folemnly warning all Our loving Subjects, as they tender their own Happiness, and that of their Posterity, to guard against all fuch Attempts, which aim at the Subversion of all regular Government within this Kingdom, and which are inconfiltent with. the Peace and Order of Society; and earnestly exhorting them at all Times, and to the utmost of their Power, to avoid and difcourage all Proceedings, tending to produce Riots and Tumults ; and We do ftrictly charge and command all Our Magistrates in and throughout Our Kingdom of Great Britain, that they do make diligent Enquiry, in order to discover the Authors and Printers of fuch wicked and feditious Writings as aforefaid, and all others who shall difperfe the fame : And We do further charge and command all Our Sheriffs, Juffices of the Peace, chief Magistrates in Our Cities, Boroughs and Corporations, and all other Our Officers and Magifrates throughout Our Kingdom of Great Britain, that they do, in their feveral and refpective Stations, take the most immediate and effectual Care to fupprefs and prevent all Riots, Tumults and other Diforders, which may be attempted to be raifed or made by any Perfon or Perfons, which, on whatever Pretext



Pretext they may be grounded, are not only contrary [to Law, but dangerous to the most important Interefts of this Kingdom: 'And We do further require and command all and every Our Magistrates aforefaid, that they do, from Time to Time, transmit to One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, due and full Information of fuch Perfons as shall be found offending as aforefaid, or in any Degree aiding or abetting therein; it being Our Determination, for the Prefervation of the Peace and Happiness of Our faithful and loving Subjects, to carry the Laws vigoroufly into Execution against fuch Offenders as aforefaid.

PROCLAMATION.

YHEREAS Hoftilities have broken out between the Most Christian King, and the King of Hungary; His Majefty, for the Prefervation and Continuance of Friendship and Amity between Him and Their faid Majefties, doth, by this His Royal Proclamation, (with the Advice of His Privy Council) strictly prohibit and forbid all His Subjects whatfoever, to take any Commission at Sea, from any Foreign Prince or State, against any other Foreign Prince or State now in Amity with His Majefty, or Their Subjects; or by Virtue or under Colour of any fuch Commission already taken, or hereafter to be taken, to fet out or employ any Veffel or Ship of War, or to ferve as Marines in any Ship or Veffel which shall be employed against any Prince or State now in Amity with His Majesty, or Their Subjects, during the present War: And all His Majefty's Subjects are required to take Notice of this His Royal Command, and to conform themselves to the same, upon Pain of incurring His Majesty's high Displeasure, and of being punished with the utmost Severity of Law and Justice. And whereas the Most Christian King hath caufed Application to be made to His Majefty, that His Majefty would, conformably to the Third Article of the Treaty of Navigation and Commerce, concluded at Verfailles the Twenty-fixth of September, One thousand seven hundred and eightyfix, renew and publish, in all His Dominions and Countries, the first and express Prohibitions contained in the faid Article: His Majefty doth hereby strictly forbid all His Subjects to receive any Commission for arming and acting at Sea as Privateers, or Letters of Reprifals, from any Enemy of the Most Christian King, or by Virtue or under Colour of

fuch Commissions or Reprisals, to disturb, infest, or any ways damage His Subjects; or to arm Ships as Privateers, or go out to Sea therewith, under the forerest Punishments that can be inflicted on the Tranfgreffors, befides being liable to make full Reflitution and Satisfaction to those to whom they have done any Damage.
