PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS Hostilities have broken out between the Moft Christian King, and the King of Hungary; His Majefty, for the Prefervation and Continuance of Friendship and Amity between Him and Their faid Majeflies, doth, by this His Royal Proclamation, (with the Advice of His Privy Council) strictly prohibit and forbid all His Subjects whatfoever, to take any Committion at Sea, from any Foreign Prince or State, against any other Foreign Prince or State now in Amity with His Majefty, or Their Subjects; or by Virtue or under Colour of any fuch Commission already taken, or hereafter to be taken, to fet out or employ any Vefiel or Ship of War, or to ferve as Marines in any Ship or Veffel which shall be employed against any Prince or State now in Amity with His Majefty, or Their Subjects, during the prefent War : And all His Majelty's Subjects are required to take Notice of this His Royal Command, and to conform themselves to the fame, upon Pain of incurring His Majefty's high Difpleafure, and of being punished with the utmost Severity of Law and Juffice. And whereas the Most Christian King hath caufed Application to be made to His Majefty, that His Majelty would, contormably to the Third Article of the Treaty of Navigation and Commerce, concluded at Verfailles the Twenty-fixth of September, One thoufand feven hundred and eightyfix, renew and publish, in all His Dominious and

Countries, the first and express Prohibitions con tained in the faid Article: His Majefty doth hereby firstly forbid all His Subjects to receive any Commiftion for arming and acting at Sea as Privateers, or Letters of Reprifals, from any Enemy of the Most Christian King, or by Virtue or under Colour of fuch Commiffions or Reprifals, to diffurb, infeft, or any ways damage His Subjects; or to arm Ships as Privateers, or go out to Sea therewith, under the feverest Punishments that can be inflicted on the Tranfgreffors, befides being liable to make full Refitution and Satisfaction to those to whom they have done any Damage.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-fifth Day of May, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-two, in the Thirty-fecond Year' of Our Reign.

Her Royal Highness the Duchess of York will have a Drawing-Room, in the Queen's Apartments at St. James's Palace, on Tuesday the 5th of June, at Two o'Clock.

Stockholm, April 27.

Mr. Ankarstroem, who discharged the Pistol at the late King of Sweden, has been fentenced, by the principal Tribunal of Stockholm, to have his Right Hand cut off, to be afterwards beheaded, and his Body to be divided into Four Parts and exposed upon the Wheel; and the Criminal was ordered to be publickly whipt in Three different Quarters of the Town, for Three fucceffive Days previous to his Execution ; which previous Punifhment having been inflicted upon him, he was this Day beheaded accordingly.

Bruffels, May 25.

This Government has received an Account, that General Sztaray, who had been quartered at Charle-roy, to watch the Movements of M. de la Fayette's Army, having underflood that a large Detachment was posted at a Place called Florenne, at no great Distance from Philipville, he refolved to attack it, though his Force was much inferior; M. de Gouvion's Numbers being estimated at Seven Thousand, and those of General Sztaray at but Three. The French, after an obstinate Resistance, in the End gave Way, leaving 150 dead, feveral wounded, Three Picces of Cannon, and all their Baggage and Ammunition; the Lofs of the Auftrians was Four killed, and Twenty-two wounded. No more particular Circumstances of this Action are as yet received.
