St. James's, June 1.

This Day the Right Honorable the Lord-Mayor, the Aldermen, Sheriffs, and Common Council of the City of London, waited upon His Majesty (being introduced by the Marquis of Salisbury, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household,) with the following Address, which was read by Sir John William Rose, the Recorder.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Lord-Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Lord-Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled, most humbly beseech your Majesty to accept our grateful Thanks for the Wisdom and Benevolence evinced by your Royal Proclamation for suppressing those seditious Publications and criminal Correspondences, which may be productive of the most alarming and dangerous Consequences.

Your faithful Citizens venerate the Constitution of this Kingdom, as established by the glorious Revolution, and improved on subsequent Occasions, because it connects the Honor of the Sovereign with the Liberty and Happiness of the Subject; and their Attachment is increased from the Consideration, that it contains the natural and regular Means of advancing those Objects with the Change of Times and Improvement of Circumstances.

We trust that the rest of your Majesty's Subjects, enjoying with us the most abundant National Happiness and Prosperity under your Majesty's mild and auspicious Government, will also with us duly estimate the Value of those Blessings, and unite in the firmest Support of your Majesty's Endeavours to continue them, by preserving our excellent Constitution from the Dangers of speculative and impracticable Theory.
