The humble Address of the Gentlemen, Clergy, Freeholders and other Inhabitants of the County of Devon.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, humbly desire to express our most grateful Sense of that paternal Care and Solitude for the Welfare of every Branch of the Community which has characterized the Whole of your Majesty's Reign. We are particularly sensible of the fresh Proof that your Majesty has given of these Dispositions in issuing your Royal Proclamation for the Prevention of those Evils, which, if suffered to gain Ground, might have endangered the Peace and Tranquillity of the Realm.

We most fully concur in the Sentiments which Parliament has expressed, of the Wisdom and Expediency of the Measures which your Majesty has taken for ensuring the Public Safety, and shall consider ourselves as united with them in every Effort for carrying those Measures into Effect.

Inviolably attached to our present Constitution, under which we are conscious of enjoying every Degree of Civil and Religious Liberty that is compatible with Order and good Government, we have seen, with the utmost Abhorrence and Indignation, the wicked and daring Attempts which have been made to unsettle the Minds of your Majesty's Subjects, and to substitute vain and delusive Theories in the Place of that Allegiance to the Sovereign and that Obedience to the Laws, which are the only Bonds of Civil Society, and the sole Sources of rational Liberty and Happiness.

Deeply impressed with these Sentiments, and carrying in our Hearts the warmest Loyalty and Affection towards your Majesty's Person, we fervently pray that we and our Posterity may long continue to enjoy, unimpaired, that happy Form of Government, which, under your Majesty and your illustrious Ancestors, has raised this Country to a Pitch of Glory and Prosperity, which, inasmuch as it is unequalled by other Nations, reflects itself, with conscious Pride and Superiority, on the Minds of all those whom Providence has placed under its auspicious Influence.
