Lologne, Sept. 30. The French of Maestricht having demanded of the States of this Dioces 25000 Crowns for six months Contribution, to commence from the first of July, the said States have this morning sent their Deputies with monies to Maestricht; But they of Juliers are in a very ill condition, for not being able to raise the 30000 Crowns demanded by the French, they must expect to see their Countrey entirely destroyed.

Englis, Odob. 4... Most of the English Soldiers that were sick here, are recovered, and sent to their several quarters. Yesternight came hither Sir Thomas Ilingsby; and Major Broxholme, and parted this morning for England. From Maestricht of the 2d instant they write, that the French have embarked all their Cannon and Ammunition, which they intend to carry for the present to Huy. They are doing the like at Charleroy, and other places, they are to restore to the Spaniards. The Dukes of Lunenburgh have, as we hear, since the death of the Bishop of Munster, seized upon his Conquests in Bremen and Ferden. From the Meuse they write, that the French intend to lay the Countrey of Juliers quite desolate.

Ditta, Odob. z. Yesterday in the evening, our Governor the Duke de Villa Hermofa returned hither, and was received at the Louvaine Gate by the Magifirates and Burghers in Arms; the Magistrates conducted his Excellency, as in a Procession, carrying white wax Tapers lighted, to the great Church, where he was received by the Archbishops and Canons; and after Te Deum was fung, his Excellency was in the same manner conducted to the Palace, attended by a numerous Train of Coaches; and this morning the feveral Councils waited upon him with their Compliments upon his fafe return, and upon zhe zonclusion of the Peace. The joy of the generality of People in these Countries is very great, to ainderstand, that there are not at present any Foreign Troops within the apanish Jurisdiction, which is a happiness they value the more, considering what they have suffered during this War. The Spanish and Dutch Troops are encamped near Hannut and Falais in the Countrey of Liege, and, as we are told, will continue together, till the Peace between France and Spain be rapified; the first are commanded by the Prince de Vaudement, and the others by the Count of Nassaw. The Duke of Luxemburgh lies with the French Army on the other fide the Meuse, between Huy and Liege, and has received a reinforcement of 3000 Horfe. The French have removed all their Cannon and Ammunition from Maestricht to Huy, and it is faid, that place will be given up to the Dutch the 15 instant. They have likewise removed their Artillery and Ammunicion from Charleroy and Aeth. We are told that there will be another Reform made of the Dutch Troops on the 1 grinstant, and his Excellency will entleavor to get those that are disbanded into the Sparish Service, for it is intended to keep up an Army, which will be paid by the feveral Provinces.
