Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Bishop, Precentor, and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of St. David, and the Clergy of the whole Diocese, beg Permission to lay at your Majesty's Royal Feet our warmest Expressions of Gratitude for your Majesty's parental Concern for the Happiness of your People, conspicuous in every Act of your Government; but more especially in your vigilant Attention to the Preservation of our happy Constitution, the Boast of these Islands, and the Envy of the World. We hold in Abhorrence those seditious Writings, in which it has been lately vilified and traduced, and we observe with Pleasure that they are universally received by your Majesty's Subjects with equal Detestation of the Malignity by which they appear to be dictated, and Contempt of the Ignorance with which they are framed. As Ministers of the Gospel of Christ, we shall ever esteem it our Duty to teach the People, that Submission to the Government under which we live is one of the most indispensable Duties of the Religion we profess; and, as Members of the Church of England, we hold ourselves particularly bound to support

the Constitutional Monarchy of our Country, with the Stability of which we are sensible the Interests of the Ecclesiastical Establishment are inseparably united: We offer, Sire, our fervent Prayers to Him by whom Kings bear Rule, that your Majesty may long reign over a loyal and grateful People, and that the British Sceptre, transmitted to a long Line of your Descendants in perpetual Succession, may, with your Sovereignty, convey to them the Emulation of your princely Virtues.
