Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most duriful and loval Sub-W E, your Majerty's moit dutiful and loyal Sub-jects, the Bifhop, Precentor, and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of St. David, and the Clergy of the whole Diocefe, beg Permiffion to lay at your Majefty's Royal Feet our warmeft Expressions of Gratitude for your Majefty's parental Concern for the Happiness of your Government; but more especially in your wigilant Attention to the Prefervation of our Act or your Government; but more expectally in your vigilant Attention to the Prefervation of our happy Conflictution, the Boalt of thefe Itlands, and the Envy of the World. We hold in Abhorrence those feditious Writings, in which it has been lately villified and traduced, and we observe with Pleasure that they are universally received by your Majeity's Subjects with a sourd Detectation of the Malior in Subjects with equal Deteftation of the Malignity ca which they appear to be difficted, and Contempt of the Ignorance with which they are frames. As Miniflers of the Gofpel of Chrift, we fhall ever effeem it our Duty to teach the People, that Sub-miffion to the Government under which we live is one of the most indispensible Duties of the Religion we profefs; and, as Members of the Church of Eng-land, we hold ourfelves particularly bound to fupport the various Attempts which have been made to

the Conflicational Monarchy of our Country, with the Stability of which we are fenfible the Interests of the Ecclefialtical Effablishment are infeparably united; We offer, Sire, our fervent Prayers to Him by whom Kings bear Rule, that your Majelty may long reign over a loyal and grateful People, and that the Bri tilh Sceptre, transmitted to a long Line of your Defcendants in perpetual Succession, may, with your Sovereignty, coavey to them the Emulation of your princely Virtues.
