#### Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, Burgeffes, and Inhabitauts of the Borough of St. Ive's, in the County of Cornwall, do befeech your Majefty to accept our grateful Thanks for your Royal Proclamation, which we think is wifely calculated to difappoint the malicious Attempts of the Enemies of our happy Conflictution.

We cannot observe, without Deteflation, the De-figns of those evil-minded Perfons who have, by the industrious Circulation of delusive and feditious Writings, endeavoured to excite Murmurs and Dif-contents amongst the People of this Kingdom, and to flir up a pernicious Spirit of wild and extravagant Innovation.

#### Whitehall, August 7.

As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; the follow-ing Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Majefly, for preventing fuch Practices, are published, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them : And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

#### Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, iany Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other. Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other, Metal, Chorneat Britain, to go into Foreign, Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Weftminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Ma-

Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Confultof Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambasfador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfond shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavour-ing to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go but of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforefaild, fuch Juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And, if fuch Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Aflizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufflciary, or the Circuits there.

#### Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, for any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon In-dictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced; forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS; and shall suffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cafe of a fubfequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again oilendingjefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or Trades to Foreigners; and is any of the King's seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and ihalt shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weltminster, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britaili, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Maelly's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the beft Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vefiel, he fhall, for every fuch Offence; forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majefly, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Em-poyment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty.

if any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Ufe of His Majefty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the fame.

#### Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefly.

B.Y thefe Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Vessel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Ucenfil or Implement whatfoever, ufed in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or linplement, or any Models or Plans thereof ; written in fuch Indenture or Writing, before the 29th.

and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Poffeffion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cuftom-house Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils ufed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
