Suffex. Arun Upper Navigation.

Whereas by Two several Standing Orders of the House of Commons, bearing Date the 7th Day of June, 1792, it was ordered and resolved (amongst other Things) "That when any Application is intended to be made to the House for Leave to bring in a Bill for making any Cut or Canal for the Purposes of Navigation, or any Cut, Canal, or Aqueduct for the Purpose of supplying any City, Town or Place with Water, or for varying or altering any such Cut, Canal or Aqueduct already made, or for making or improving the Navigation of any River, or for altering any Act of Parliament passed for any or either of those Purposes, (in which Bill for altering any such Act it is intended to give Power for raising any further or additional Rates, Tolls or Duties) Notice of such intended Application shall be inserted Three Times in the London Gazette, in the Months of August and September, or either of them, previous to the Session of Parliament in which such Application is intended to be made; and that such Notices shall contain the Names of the Parishes and Townships in, and through which any such Cut, Canal or Aqueduct is intended to be carried, varied or altered, or in which such River, or such Part thereof as is intended to be made navigable, or the Navigation thereof to be improved, is situated."
