THE following Address having been transmitted to the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been by him presented to the King: Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Unto the KING.

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Presbytery of Dingwall, beg Leave to approach the Throne, and to express our sincere Gratitude for every new Instance of your Majesty's Exertions towards the Maintenance of our happy Constitution, the Preservation of the Peace, and the promoting of the Prosperity of these Kingdoms. Sensible of the invaluable Blessings which we enjoy, as Citizens of a free Country, we should behold with Abhorrence every Attempt to unhinge the System of our Government, as planned at the ever-memorable Revolution, and we should consider with Indignation any Writings which could possibly have this baneful Tendency. Feeling these Sentiments, it is with the utmost Pleasure we assure your Majesty that we and our People are entire Strangers to all such Views or Publications; and that, however ardently we do wish for the Correction of those Abuses which, in the general Imperfection of human Affairs, may have crept into our Constitution, and for the full Invigoration of every Principle of Liberty which is consistent with regular Government, we shall, by our publick Instructions and by our private Example, discourage any Approach towards Sedition; we shall earnestly inculcate every Degree of respectful Subordination to the Laws of the Land; and we shall sedulously cherish among our People habitual Veneration for the Principles of our Constitution, as established at the Glorious Revolution.

That your Majesty may long reign over a free and a happy People; that you may lay down your Earthly Crown only to be exchanged for a Heavenly one; and that Almighty God may confer his Blessing on every Branch of your Family, are the earnest Prayer of your Majesty's affectionate Sub-

jects, the Ministers and Elders of the Presbytery of Dingwall.

IN Pursuance of the Directions of an Act passed in the Twenty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, intituled, "An Act to repeal so much of Two Acts, made in the Tenth and Fifteenth Years of the Reiga of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out Writs for the Election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the Manner therein mentioned; and for substituting other Provisions for the like Purposes;" I do hereby give Notice, that it hath been certified to me in Writing, under the Hands of Two Members of Parliament, that the Honorable *George Augustus North*, commonly called Lord North, late Member of Parliament for the Borough of Banbury, in the County of Oxford, is become a Peer of Great Britain, and summoned to Parliament; and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new Writ for the electing of a Burgess to serve in this present Parliament for the said Borough of Banbury, in the Room of the said *George Augustus North*, commonly called Lord North, now a Peer of Great Britain, and summoned to Parliament as aforesaid, at the End of Fourteen Days after the Insertion of this Notice in the Gazette.
