## APPRENTICE DUTY INDEMNITY.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, May 10, 1792.

**H**IS Majesty's Commissioners for Managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That by a Clause in an Act of the present Session of Parliament, it is enacted, for the Relief of all Persons who have omitted to pay the several Rates and Duties, or any Part thereof, upon Monies given, paid or contracted for, with Clerks, Apprentices or Servants, and also who have omitted to insert and write in Words at Length in Indentures or other Writings relating to the Service of any Clerk, Apprentice or Servant the full Sum or Sums of Money, or any Part thereof, received or contracted for, with or in Relation to every such Clerk, Apprentice or Servant, that upon Payment of double the Rates and Duties upon the Monies, or such Part of the Monies, so omitted or neglected to be paid, and also so omitted to be inserted and written in such Indenture or Writing, before the 29th Day of September next, to the proper Officer, and tendering the same to be stamped at this Office, every such Indenture, or other Writing, shall be good and valid, and the Persons so offending be excused from any Penalty incurred by the Omission thereof; except those against whom any Prosecution shall be now depending.

Paths, from the River Hull or River Humber to Monk Bridge, or to the Town of Leven; and that such Cut or Canal is intended to be carried through, to, or into the several Parishes, Townships, or Places following, or some of them, that is to say, Marfleet, Sudcoats, Bilton, Sutton, Drypool, Waghen otherwise Wavon, Swaine, Benningholme, Benningholme Grange, Fairholme, North Skirlaugh, Rowton, Meaux, Arnold, Long Riston, Routh, Weel, Tickton, Eske, Saint John of Beverley, Heigholme, Brandes Burton, Barfall, Hallytrebolme, and Leven. ## Sussex. Arun Upper Navigation.

**W**hereas by Two several Standing Orders of the House of Commons, bearing Date the 7th Day of June, 1792, it was ordered and resolved (amongst other Things) "That when any Application is intended to be made to the House for Leave to bring in a Bill for making any Cut or Canal for the Purposes of Navigation, or any Cut, Canal, or Aqueduct for the Purpose of supplying any City, Town or Place with Water, or for varying or altering any such Cut, Canal or Aqueduct already made, or for making or improving the Navigation of any River, or for altering any Act of Parliament passed for any or either of those Purposes, (in which Bill for altering any such Act it is intended to give Power for raising any further or additional Rates, Tolls or Duties) Notice of such intended Application shall be inserted Three Times in the London Gazette, in the Months of August and September, or either of them, previous to the Session of Parliament in which such Application is intended to be made; and that such Notices shall contain the Names of the Parishes and Townships in, to or through which any such Cut, Canal or Aqueduct is intended to be carried; varied or altered, or in which such River, or such Part thereof as is intended to be made
