The Plague has made an alarming Progress at Rodosto, Gallipoli, the Dardanelles, Salonica and Adrianople, but has decreased very much at Smirna.

Whitehall, September 11, 1792.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that about Two o'Clock in the Morning of Friday the 27th of August last, the Theatre in New-street, in the Town of Birmingham, in the County of Warwick, was discovered to be on Fire, by which the same was, (except the Walls) entirely consumed, together with some adjoining Building and Out Offices; and that there is great Reason to believe that the same was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire by some Person or Persons unknown.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in setting Fire to the said Premises, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually set Fire thereto) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

APPRENTICE DUTY INDEMNITY.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, May 10, 1792.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for Managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That by a Clause in an Act of the present Session of Parliament, it is enacted, for the Relief of all Persons who have omitted to pay the several Rates and Duties, or any Part thereof, upon Monies given said or contracted for, with Clerks, Apprentices or Servants, and also who have omitted to insert and write in Words at Length in Indentures or other Writings relating to the Service of any Clerk, Apprentice or Servant the full Sum or Sums of Money, or any Part thereof, received or contracted for, with or in Relation to every such Clerk, Apprentice or Servant, that upon Payment of double the Rates and Duties upon the Monies, or such Part of the Monies, so omitted or neglected to be paid, and also so omitted to be inserted and written in such Indenture or Writing, before the 29th Day of September next, to the proper Officer, and tendering the same to be stamped at this Office, every such Indenture, or other Writing, shall be good and valid, and the Persons so offending be excused from any Penalty incurred by the Omission thereof; except those against whom any Prosecution shall be now depending.
