HE laft week, the weather being very flormy, came in here the Recovery of London, bound in Ballaft for Corke in Ireland, the Mary of London, fohn Confel Malter, bound for Virginia, the Advenure of London for The Jarbadoes, and the Lucretia of Amfterdam, bound for Bourdeaux. Here are feveral finall Veffels in Harbor, the weather being ftill ftormy.

Legborne, Sept. 26; By a Veffel arrived from Tunis we have advice, that Sir John Narborougb, having with him 24 fail of Mcn of War, Firethips, Sc. had in the Road of Cercelli burnt 12 Algierine Barks laden with Corn for Argiers; that he had taken two Algierine Men of War, and freed a Veffel which was their Prize; that fending fome Men alhore, they had taken 70 Camels laden with Oyl, Sc. and that afterwards Sir John Narborough went with his Squadron to Argiers, and battered the place; of which we expect a confirmation.

Genous, Sept. 28. The 26 arrived here the Friend-Jhip, Fohn Seldon Malter, from Trappaui, by whom we have advice, that the Spanish Armada, confisting in 14 Men of War, were failed from Palermo for Bateelona; and from Legborne we have an account, that a Veffel arrived there from Tunin, faid that Sir Fohn. Narborough was with his Squadron, confisting in 24 Sail, before Argiers, and that he battered that place.

Landaw, Otheb. 9. The Marefchal de Crequi having confumed all the Forage in the Lower Alface, removed the 4th inflant from Minfelds to Weiffembourg, the next day from thence to Werdt, and the 6th to Ingweiker, and the fame day went to view the fituation of the Caffle of Liebtemburg, in which there is an Imperial Garifon: the 7th the Marquis de la Frefeliere, Lieutenant-General of the Artillery, was fent thither with feveral pieces of Cannon, and eight Battalions to attack it. The Impersal Army continues encamped near their Bridge at Serecke, but have fent the Sieur Schultz with a Body of Horle towards Strasburg. The Count d'Are is arrived in the Imperial Army, to command the Artillery in the room of Prince Herman of Baden, who is fick at Strasburg.

Strasburg, Olbob. 10. One of our Parties had the good fortune three or four days fince to meet a French Convoy near Weiffemburg, and to defeat those that guarded it, of whom they killed 250 upon the place, took several prisoners, and 600 Horses. The Sieur Schultz is on the other fide the Rhing with a Body of Horse, and if there be occasion, we shall receive him into the place. The Garifon we have already confifts in 10000 men. The French Army is encamped at Ingweiler, from whence they detached the 7th inflant fome Truops to beliege the Calile of Lichtemberg.

From the French Camp at Ingweiler in Alface, Oft. 12. The Marefchal de Crequi having thought it necessary to pollels himfelf of the Town and Cuffle of Liebtemberg, detached eight Battalions for that purpole; upon their approach the Imperialis that were in the Town abandoned it, and retited into the Caffle, against which the Trenches were opened the 8th inflant, but our men meeting with greater difficulties than they had expected, on the 10th the Marefehal caufed the Trenches to be opened in another place, on the left of the former, which were carried that night to the Ditch, where they begun to lodge themfelves; but in the morning they were forced to quit their Poil, which they would endeavor to recover the last night, as likewise to make a Gallery near the out Wall to the Baffion, against which the first Treaches were directed; by which means the Miners will work more tecun ely, which they have not hitherto been able to do. We have they have not hitherto been able to do. loft above 100 Men, and feveral Officers before the place fit ce we begun the Siege. The Mareschal de Crequi has been there in perfon these two laft ights, and has ordered two Battalions more to reinforce. the Belingers. The Mareschal de Crequi having cauled the Count d'Aubijoux to be arrested, for having affronted another Gentleman, he made his efcape the toth inflant, but had the mi fortune to be killed near Saverne by the Country people.

Brussels, Octobe 14. We are expecting with fome impatience the Ratifications of the Peace from Spain. In the mean time the French have removed all their Cannon and Ammunition out of the places they are to reflore, and have drawn out greatest part of the Garifons, to join the Duke of Luxemburg, who is marched with his Army towards Aix la Chapelle, and hath put Garifons into Sistard, Hensberg, and Dueren, the Troops that were in the latter retiring upon the approach of the French, and putting themfelves into *Fuliers*, to defend that place. The Duke of *Luxemburg* has likewife left a good Garjfon in Huy, which they are fortifying. The Confederate Troops of Lunenburg-Zell, and Ofnabrug, are marched to the Rhine, Monfieur de Louvigny hath the Van, and is advanced as far as Bonne, and Monfieur Chauvet, who covers their march with his Horfe and Dragoons, was on Thefday laft near Gologne, and we suppose they are by this time advanced towards Coblenta, and Mentz, but Major General Stden is partell from them, and is gone with the Brandenburg and Munfler Troops towards Campen.

Diug, Oldob. 19. There happened the other day an ill accident at Charleroy, a confiderable sumber of Grenadoes taking fire, by which 1;0 men perifleed. From the Maule we have advice, that the Duke of Luxemburg had forced the City of Aix 14 Chapelle to receive a Garifon of 4 or 5000 men; that it was believed he would attack the City of Juliers, and that in the mean time the French do totally
