HE following Address having been transmitted to the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been by him presented to the King: Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Bishops and Clergy of the Scotch Episcopal Church.

Most Gracious Sowereign,

W/E, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Bishops and Clergy of the Scotch Episcopal Church, most humbly request your Royal Permission to approach the Throne with Assurance of that inviolable Affection and Duty with which we are animated towards your Majesty's Person and Government.

While we have the inexpressible Satisfaction to see the Members of our Communion enjoying the free Exercise of their Religious Worship, we trust we shall ever seel a lively Grantude for so great a Blefang; and that they may continue to deserve the Favour they enjoy, we will not cease to impress their Minds with the purest Principles of Loyalty to your Majesty, and of Submission to the Laws.

Convinced as we are that the Peace and Prosperity of the British Empire depend entirely, under God, on the Preservation of our admirable Constitution, we beg Leave to acknowledge, with becoming Thankfulness, your Majesty's great Care and Attention to the Happiness of your People, so seasonably manifested in your Majesty's late gracious Proclamation. Deeply sensible of this Instance of your Majesty's paternal Goodness, we will not fail to use our best Endeavours to support that wise and equitable System of Government, which it is not more the Duty than it is the Interest of all your Majesty's Subjects to maintain.

That your Majosty may long live to sway, the Scriptre over a loyal and affectionate People; and

that the Constitution of these Kingdoms may be transmitted unimpaired to the latest Generation, through the Princes of your illustrious House, is the fervent Prayer of,


GENERAL POST - OFFICE, September 22, 1792.

TO prevent the Loss of entire Notes or Drafts, payable to Bearer, in Letters put into any Post-Office or Receiving-House, the Postmaster-General repeat the Recommendation, so often inserted in the London Gazettes, and circulated by Hand-Bills throughout the Kingdom; namely, to cut all fuch Notes or Drafts

in half in the following Form, to fend them at Two different Times, and to wait for the Return of the Post till the Receipt of One Half is acknowledged before the other is sent.

And, when any Cash, in Gold or Silver, or when any Rings or Lockets, &c. are sent per Post from London, particular Care should be taken to deliver the same to the Clerk at the Window, or to the Clerk of the Money-Book, at the General Post-Office; and, when any such Letter is to be sent from a Country Post-Office, it should be delivered into the Hands of the Postmaster.
