

GENERAL POST-OFFICE, September 22, 1792.

TO prevent the Loss of entire Notes or Drafts, payable to Bearer, in Letters put into any Post-Office or Receiving-House, the Postmaster-General repeat the Recommendation, so often inserted in the London Gazettes, and circulated by Hand-Bills throughout the Kingdom; namely, to cut all such Notes or Drafts in half in the following Form, to send them at Two different Times, and to wait for the Return of the Post till the Receipt of One Half is acknowledged before the other is sent.

And, when any Cash, in Gold or Silver, or when any Rings or Locketts, &c. are sent per Post from London, particular Care should be taken to deliver the same to the Clerk at the Window, or to the Clerk of the Money-Book, at the General Post-Office; and, when any such Letter is to be sent from a Country Post-Office, it should be delivered into the Hands of the Postmaster.

Conformably with the standing Orders of the Honourable the House of Commons, Notice is hereby given, that a Petition is intended to be presented, and an Application made at the next Session of Parliament for Leave to cut and maintain a navigable Canal from or near Sowerby Bridge Wharf, in the Parish of Halifax, in the County of York, by Way of Todmorden, Deyne-Head, and near Rochdale, to or near Manchester, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, and from thence to communicate with the Canal of his Grace the Duke of Bridgewater; at or near a Place called Corn Brook, in the said Parish of Manchester: And all Persons are desired to observe, that the same is intended to be carried, and upon the Line proposed will pass, in, to, or through the several Townships or Hamlets of Skircoat, Warley, Midgley, Wadsworth, Sowerby, Hestonhall, and Longfield, in the Parish of Halifax, in the County of York aforesaid, and in, to or through the several Townships or Hamlets of Hundersfield, Butterworth, and Capleton, in the Parish of Rochdale, in the County of Lancaster aforesaid, and in, to or through the several Townships or Hamlets of Hosiwood, Thornham and Middleton, in the Parish of Middleton, in the said County of Lancaster, and in, to or through the Townships or Hamlets of Chadderton and

Tonge, in the Parish of Prestwich cum Oldham in the County of Lancaster, and in, to or through the several Townships or Hamlets of Failsworth, Newton, Manchester, Droylsden, Bradford, Bescwick, Aradwich, Chorlton Row, Hulme, Moss Side, and Shetford, in the Parish of Manchester aforesaid: And also to cut and maintain certain navigable Branches in, to or through the respective Townships and Parishes aforesaid, or in, to or through some of them, with convenient Towing Paths, Drains and Reservoirs to the said intended Canal, and such intended Branches therefrom respectively; and that a Map or Plan of the said intended Canal and collateral Branches, together with a Book of Reference, containing a List of the Names of the Owners or reputed Owners and Occupiers of Lands through which the same will pass, will be deposited for Public Inspection at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the West Riding of the County of York, kept at Wakefield, in the said County of York; and another such Plan and Book of Reference will be deposited for such Purpose with the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of Lancaster, kept at Leigh, in the said County of Lancaster, on or before the 11th Day of November next.
