THE following Address having been transmitted to the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home-Department, has been by him presented to the King: Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

*May it please your Majesty,*

WE your Majesty's most faithful and dutiful Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Presbytery of St. Andrew's, beg Leave to approach the Throne with unfeigned Expressions of our most cordial Attachment to your Majesty's Person, and to that Form of Government which is so happily established in these Realms.

Being fully persuaded that the British Constitution is in itself the most excellent and most favourable to the Ends of wise Policy; knowing by Experience that it is productive of the greatest Good to Society, and having entire Confidence that all the Blessings resulting from that Constitution are secure to us and to our Fellow-Subjects under your Majesty's equitable and fatherly Administration, we cannot, without Grief and Indignation, observe the industrious Circulation of Writings calculated to excite a Spirit of Innovation, Discontent and Sedition.

We are happy, however, in being able to assure your Majesty, that the great Body of the People under our Care are unaffected with the Principles contained in such Writings; that they are deeply and gratefully sensible of the real Liberty and of the invaluable Privileges which they enjoy as British Subjects; and that they are not disposed to meddle with those who are given to change.

Amidst all our other Religious Instructions and Exhortations to fear God, we shall never neglect to inculcate on our Hearers the great Duties of honouring the King, and of leading quiet and peaceable Lives: And we shall, in our Place, exert ourselves in confirming their dutiful and loyal Attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government, in strengthening their Veneration for that Civil and Ecclesiastical Constitution, which is the Glory of our Country,

and in explaining to them the many gracious Marks of your Majesty's paternal Attention to the Peace, Prosperity and best Interests of your People.

Our daily and fervent Prayer is, that the Sovereign of the Universe, by whom Kings reign, may have your Majesty under his holy Protection; that He may long preserve your Majesty's Life; as the Pledge of Heaven's Good-Will to these Lands; and that He may increase your Majesty's Felicity in the perfect Union of all Ranks, for supporting the Honour of the Crown, advancing the Publick Good, and maintaining the Tranquillity of the Kingdom.

GENERAL POST-OFFICE, September 22, 1792.

To prevent the Loss of entire Notes or Drafts, payable to Bearer, in Letters put into any Post-Office or Receiving-House, the Postmaster-General repeat the Recommendation, so often inserted in the London Gazettes, and circulated by Hand-Bills throughout the Kingdom; namely, to cut all such Notes or Drafts in half in the following Form, to send them at Two different Times, and to wait for the Return of the Post till the Receipt of One Half is acknowledged before the other is sent.

And, when any Cash, in Gold or Silver, or when any Rings or Locketts, &c. are sent per Post from London, particular Care should be taken to deliver the same to the Clerk at the Window, or to the Clerk of the Money-Book, at the General Post-Office; and, when any such Letter is to be sent from a Country Post-Office, it should be delivered into the Hands of the Postmaster.
