of His Majesty's Treasury, a DISCOUNT OF TEN POUNDS PER CENT. will begin to be allowed at their Office in Somerset Place, on MONDAY NEXT, THE 11th DAY OF OCTOBER, to all Purchasers, to the VALUE OF TEN SHILLINGS, OR UPWARDS, of each Sort of the stamped Labels severally used in denoting the Hat, Glove, and Perfumery Duties:

And it being their Lordships Intention, THAT THE BENEFIT OF THIS ENLARGED DISCOUNT SHOULD NOT BE CONFINED SOLELY TO THE METROPOLIS, BUT BE EQUALLY EXTENDED TO THE RESPECTIVE DEALERS IN ALL PARTS OF THE KINGDOM; the Commissioners do give further Notice, that the Distributers of Stamps, and their Deputies and Agents, in the different Counties, will be authorized to MAKE THE SAME ALLOWANCE FROM THE TIME BEFORE MENTIONED:

And the Commissioners do hereby also give Notice to the said several Dealers, that it is expected and required that none of these Articles shall be sold, without the proper Stamps being previously PASTED OR AFFIXED thereto, as the Law directs; and that effectual Measures will be taken to detect and prosecute all such Persons as shall, after this Caution, defraud the Public Revenue herein.
