That the following Clause of said Ast be published in the London Gazette for the Information of all Persons whom it may concern.

Extract of the Act 7th and 8th of William III. Chap. 19. Sect. 6.

Be it enacted, that from and after the last Day
of March, 1696, no Person or Persons whatsoever shall ship, or cause to be shipped, or put on
Board any Ship or Vessel whatsoever, any Molten
Silver or Bullion whatsoever, either in Bars, Inogots, Wedges, Cakes, Pinas, or any other Form
whatsoever, unless a Certificate be first had and
obtained from the Court of Lord Mayor and Alodermen of the City of London, Oath having been
made before the said Court by the Owner or Ownor of such Molten Silver or Bullion, and likewise
by Two or more credible Witnesses, that the same
Molten Silver and Bullion, and every Part and
Parcel thereof, was and is Foreign Bullion,
and that no Part thereof was, before the same

"was Molten, the Coin of this Realm, or Clippings thereof, nor Plate wrought within this
Kingdom; which Oath the faid Court of Lord
Mayor and Aldermen of the City of London, are
authorized to administer, and to examine strictly
all and every such Person as shall make such Oath

And the Commissioners do hereby also give Notice to the said several Dealers, that it is expected and required that none of these Articles shall be sold, without the proper Stamps being previously PASTED OR AFFIXED thereto, as the Law directs; and that effectual Measures will be taken to detect and prosecute all such Persons as shall, after this Caution, defraud the Public Revenue herein.

GENERAL POST-OFFICE, September 22, 1792.

TO prevent the Loss of entire Notes or Drafts, payable to Bearer, in Letters put into any Post-Office or Receiving-House, the Postmaster-General repeat the Recommendation, so often inserted in the London Gazettes, and circulated by Hand-Bills throughout the Kingdom; namely, to cut all such Notes or Drafts

in half in the following Form, to fend them at Two different Times, and to wait for the Return of the Post till the Receipt of One Half is acknowledged before the other is sent.

And, when any Cash, in Gold or Silver, or when any Rings or Lockets, &c. are sent per Post from London, particular Care should be taken to deliver the same to the Clerk at the IVindow, or to the Clerk of the Money-Book, at the General Post-Office; and, when any such Letter is to be sent from a Country Post-Office, it should be delivered into the Hands of the Postmaster.
