THE Plague has for a few Weeks paft in a great Measure ceased in the Morea, and supposed, by some, to be entirely suspended; however none of the Foreign Confuls or Merchants who took Refuge here have yet thought it adviseable to return to their Refidence.

RESOLVED,

T HAT it having appeared to this Court that the Perfons who apply for Certificates to enable them to export from this Kingdom Molten Silver or Bullion, are not fufficiently apprized that it is the exprefs Duty of the Lord Mayor and Court of Aldermen of this City *fridly to examine* all fuch Perfons, and to require them to prove their Molten Silver or Bullion upon Oath, as contained in the Act of the 7th and 8th of William the Third, Chap. 19.

That the following Claufe of faid Act be published in the London Gazette for the Information of all Perfons whom it may concern.

Extract of the Act 7th and 8th of William III. Chap. 19. Sect. 6.

" Be it enacted, that from and after the laft Day of March, 1696, no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever thall fhip, or caufe to be fhipped, or put on Board any Ship or Veffel whatfoever, any Molten Silver or Bullion whatfoever, either in Bars, Ingots, Wedges, Cakes, Pinas, or any other Form whatfoever, unlefs a Certificate be firft had and of obtained from the Court of Lord Mayor and Al-

" dermen of the City of London, Oath having been " made before the faid Court by the Owner or Own-" ers of fach Molten Silver or Bullion, and likewife " by Two or more credible Witneffes, that the fame " Molten Silver and Bullion, and every Part and " Parcel thereof, was and is Foreign Bullion; " and that no Part thereof was, before the fame " was Molten, the Coin of this Realm, or Clip-" pings thereof, nor Plate wrought within this " Kingdom; which Oath the faid Court of Lord " Mayor and Aldermen of the City of London, are " authorized to adminifer, and to examine flrictly " all and every fuch Perfon as fhall make fuch Oath " concerning the Premifes."
