HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Thursday the Fifteenth Day of this instant November, be further prorogued to Thursday the Third Day of January now next following.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no Person or Persons whatever shall, from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, until the 1st Day of March, 1793, directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry or convey, or cause or procure to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed, out of or from any Port or Place in Great Britain, or load or lay on Board, or cause or procure to be loaded or laid on Board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported or carried out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Wheat or Wheat Flour.—His Majesty nevertheless, by the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit to order, and doth hereby order, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prohibit the Exportation of any Foreign Wheat or Wheat Flour, which shall have been imported into this Kingdom, and warehoused in the Manner and upon the Conditions mentioned in an Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His

Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn exported;" nor to prohibit the carrying Coastwise, or the carrying out and exporting of Wheat and Wheat Flour, in the Manner and in the same Proportions and Quantities, and from and to the same Ports and Places, as is by the said Act allowed, at such Times as Wheat and Wheat Flour are prohibited to be exported, by reason of the Price of Wheat and Wheat Flour being at or above the Prices mentioned in Table B. in the said Act contained, subject to the like Securities, Conditions, Regulations and Restrictions, Forfeitures and Penalties, as are required and imposed by the said Act, or by any other Act now in Force, in any of the Cases aforesaid.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

London, November 10.

On Thursday last Sir James Sanderson, Knt. Lord Mayor Elect for the Year ensuing, was sworn at Guildhall; when the Chair and other Ensigns of Mayoralty were surrendered to him in the accustomed Manner.

Yesterday the new Lord Mayor, accompanied by the late Lord Mayor, the Aldermen, Recorder and Sheriffs, in their Scarlet Gowns, went in their Coaches to the Water-side, the Sword and Mace being carried before them, and the City Officers attending; and from thence proceeded in the City Barge, attended by the several Companies in their respective Barges, adorned with Streamers and Pendants, to Westminster; and having walked round the Hall, and solemnly saluted all the Courts, they went to the Exchequer Bar, and the new Lord Mayor

did there take the Oaths appointed; and having recorded Warrants of Attorney in the proper Courts, returned by Water to Black Friars, and from thence in Coaches, with the usual Solemnity, to Guildhall, where a magnificent Entertainment was provided; at which were present several of the Foreign Ministers, the Great Officers of State, divers of the Nobility, Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, the Judges, and many other Persons of Quality and Distinction.

IRISH STATE LOTTERY.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties think it necessary, on the approaching Drawing of the Irish Lottery, to give this Publick Notice, that the utmost Exertions will be made by this Office for the carrying into full Effect the several Provisions of the Lottery-Regulation, and the Lottery-Vagrant Acts, against all Persons who, in Violation of those Laws, attempt to transact ILLEGAL INSURANCES, either in LICENSED or UNLICENSED OFFICES, or in PUBLICK HOUSES OF ANY DESCRIPTION WHATSOEVER: And further, that having at length put a total End to every Species of that pernicious Practice, which so long prevailed by the SALE OF CHANCES; and therefore being the better enabled to prepare and arrange a Plan for crushing at once and generally the only remaining Abuse that has attached on the State Lotteries, the same was submitted to the Consideration of the Lord Mayor and Aldermen of London, and of the Chairmen and Justices for Middlesex and Westminster, and for the several Districts under the new Police Act, by whom it has been unanimously determined to co-operate in Support of the Measures prepared by this Office, and to give their utmost Assistance in the speedy and total Suppression of the Abuse, and in the active and effectual Maintenance of the remedial Laws provided for that Purpose.
